Hadley Community Preservation Act Funds for Lake Warner Vote "Yes" at Hadley Town Meeting on May 4th, 2023

The Friends of Lake Warner proposes to engage the services of SWCA Environmental Consultants to oversee the development of the Lake Management Plan. Located in Amherst, SWCA has experience working with other lake associations, such as Friends of Leverett Pond.

We envision working with SWCA in a two-phase process. The first phase, for which we are seeking CPA funds at the May 2023 town meeting, will be undertaken during the summer of 2023. The scope of the project will include:

- Survey of lake users
- Review of historical reports and testing data
- Additional testing of waters and sediments
- · Survey of the aquatic plants
- Development of Lake Management Plan
- Presentation of Plan to FOLW Board

Phase 2 of the project, targeted to begin in 2024, will involve the implementation of the Lake Management Plan recommendations including presentation to the Conservation Commission and filing of necessary permits. We envision a secondary application for CPA funds to support Phase 2.

Community Benefits

The Lake Warner Management Plan will benefit the lake, surrounding wetlands and aquatic and wetland dependent species. These benefits will improve both the aesthetic and recreational value of the lake by improving conditions for fishing, boating and wildlife observation. The lake has historical significance in Hadley and maintaining the lake and improving water quality conditions will benefit the entire community.

How you can help

We hope the residents of the Town of Hadley will support our request of CPA funds by voting "Yes" at Town Meeting on May 4, 2023 at 7pm at Hopkins Academy in Hadley.

You can also support Lake Warner by making a donation. We will need an additional \$6,000 in matching funds to complete the project. We also require approximately \$15,000 per year in operating funds which is raised through donations and fund raising efforts.

Last but not least, the Friends of Lake Warner is always seeking volunteers to support our Lake management projects including water chestnut pulls, water testing and user engagement. We also are looking for board members with experience with non-profits.

We had an unusually mild February this year, masquerading as late March or early April and enticing skunk cabbage and crocus to emerge weeks ahead of schedule. The preternatural warmth evoked conflicting emotions: alarm at the irrefutable evidence of global warming, and at the same time delight in a balmy, sunny day in late winter.

On February 18, I enjoyed a long walk through the "triangle" neighborhood of North Hadley, planning to make a side trip to the Friends of Lake Warner peninsula off of Stockbridge Road. At the peninsula trailhead I was surprised to find a group of artists, ranging in age from 13 to 60+ years, displaying and discussing drawings they had made of the lake and woods. The group's instructor, Julio Neijens, leads art forays on weekends to easily accessible scenic spots in Hadley and surrounding towns. He emphasizes process and enjoyment, and offers a supportive framework for students to develop their observational skills. When I talked to the group, 13 year old Edward was particularly enthusiastic, crediting the drawing class with helping him get through the pandemic.

Julio Neijns and his students are not the only artists to draw inspiration from the lake. The Amherst Plein Air Society, headed by


If you are passionate about local conservation and would like to participate in our mission to improve the local watershed that directly impacts Lake Warner, then please consider applying.
